HEAD COACH ADAM





As Adam Howarth enters his eighth year as head coach of the Eastern Illinois men's soccer program, he looks to continue the winning tradition while coaching stellar student-athletes.

No stranger to Panther soccer, Howarth played four years at Lakeside Field under Cizo Mosina and graduated from EIU. He was chosen as the program's

seventh head coach in July 2000 and has moved into fourth place on the all-time wins list.

Howarth's 2006 team proved to be one of his top all-around units. Defensively, the Panthers surrendered the fewest number of goals (18) in the Missouri Valley Conference and shutout seven opponents.

Sophomore forward Brad Peters followed in the footsteps of other formidable strikers like Jason Thompson and Jimmy Klatter, and enjoyed a breakout season. The Metro St. Louis native led the MVC with 11 goals, recording just the second double-figure goal total by an EIU underclassman in the program's Valley era. Team captain Mick Galeski,

who has developed into one of the finest all-around midfielders in the conference since coming to Charleston from his native England, joined Peters on the MVC First Team and NSCAA Midwest Region Second Team.

Thanks to a great run away from Charleston, posting eight victories in road or neutral site games, the '06 Panthers finished with 11 wins. While an overtime win

at long-standing rival Western Illinois and the team title at UW-Green Bay's Nike Classic highlighted EIU's early-season success, the victory over Missouri State in the opening round of the MVC Tournament was unquestionably the pinnacle of the campaign.

During his first year Howarth led the Panthers to a 12-6-1 overall mark, undefeated record against non-conference opponents and fifthplace Valley finish (6-5). The Panthers finished in the top half of one of the nation's elite conferences, as the Valley sent two teams to the NCAA Final Four.

He coached the nation's leading goal scorer (All-American Jason Thompson), three all-conference players and wound up second in the MVC Coach of the Year voting.

When Thompson was drafted in the second round - the 15th overall pick – of the 2003 Major League Soccer draft, he made history. becoming Eastern's first-ever draft pick. Signed as a Nike-Project 40 player, Thompson was named to SoccerAmerica's National Team of the Week and most importantly represented EIU on the United States Under-23 national team.

During Howarth's tenure, six EIU players have earned NSCAA All-Midwest Region honors. Prior to Galeski and Peters being recognized last fall, Thompson was a Second Team pick in 2000 and First Team selection in '02. Jimmy Klatter earned Second Team honors in '05 while Derrick Perry ('01) and Abraham Martinez ('03) each received Third Team recognition following their senior seasons.

Additionally, an Eastern player has received All-MVC accolades 18 times. With Klatter earning First Team All-MVC kudos for the second straight season in '05, the forward became just the second player in EIU's


> Division I era to be a four-time all-conference honoree. Klatter finished his career among the program's all-time leaders in goals and points and earned an invitation to the MLS's Senior Player Combine.

> In 2005, Howarth led the Panthers back to the MVC Tournament. Eastern stood tall against thirdseeded Vanderbilt before eventually losing in the sixth round of a shootout. Other season highlights included Klatter's two hat tricks, the EIU defense allowing more than one goal only once in the Panthers' eight home games and an EIU record three Panthers earning MVC All-Freshman team recognition.

> In 2004 Howarth's team did not allow a goal until the 21st minute of the third game, and that came on a penalty kick.

He spent the 1999 season as the EIU assistant

women's soccer coach. The Panther women won the Ohio Valley Conference regular season and tournament championship. Six players received all-conference honors, including the Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year awards.

In 1995 he started the boys soccer program at St. Anthony High School in Effingham, III. He was both the junior varsity and varsity head coach during his four-year stint. Howarth was named the 1998 Illinois High School Sectional Coach of the Year and St. Anthony won the IHSA Sectional Sportsmanship of the Year award. The Bulldogs finished 10-8-6, their best record since the program's inception.

Howarth has coached at college and high school camps throughout the nation along with assisting and now directing the Eastern Illinois camps over the past 14 years. The EIU Soccer School has become one of the top team camps in Illinois as 20 teams competed for the title during the summer of 2007.

Howarth serves as a state coach for the Illinois Youth Soccer Association and the Olympic Development Program. In 2006, he was an assistant exact with Illinois ORP (101) team that alsimed the national

an assistant coach with Illinois ODP ('91) team that claimed the national championship in its age division. He'll return to the team in the spring to help that team defend its title.

A native of Slough, England, Howarth graduated from Eastern in 1993 with a bachelors degree in history and journalism. He also received his masters degree in athletic administration from Eastern.

He received the Premier Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of American in the summer of 2005, his United States Soccer Federation 'A' license in 2003 and an English F.A. badge in 1996. Howarth is a member of the U.S. Soccer Coaches Association as well as the NSCAA.

Adam and his wife Laura have two children, Sophie and Sebastian.





Dino Raso is in his third year as an assistant coach on Adam Howarth's staff. Raso played at Eastern under coach Cizo Mosina from 1988-91 and was a teammate of Howarth's.

After earning both a bachelors degree and MBA from Eastern, he returned to his native Canada and played in the Premier Division of the Ontario Soccer League. He was also an amateur coach in Ontario from 1995-2000, compiling a 75-9-2 record, before returning to the States and joining the Barry University (Fla.) coaching staff in 2002.

From 2002-2004 Barry went 40-13-4 and was always ranked among the NCAA Division II Top 20. The Bucs won the Sunshine State Conference in 2002 and finished second in 2003 and 2004.

Raso earned Masters degrees in Sports Management (2003) and Higher Education Administration (2005) during his time at Barry. Along with his assistant coach duties, he also worked in the athletics compliance office, Career and Counseling Center and Recreation and Wellness Center.

He holds a US Soccer National "A" License and a Level 1 NSCAA Goalkeepers License.

Raso resides in Charleston with his wife Katharyn and stepdaughter Michaela.

Chad Jones is in his fourth year as an assistant coach on Adam Howarth's staff. The Decatur native is also currently the executive director of the Springfield Area Soccer Association.

Previously, he was the director of the MidState Soccer Club and Academy, where he oversaw the grand opening of the Decatur Soccer Complex. The facility's first event was the annual Governor's Cup, which featured Eastern Illinois, Northern Illinois, Western Illinois and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville.

Jones spent two years at Millikin, his alma mater, as an assistant coach for both the men and women's team. The 2001 men's team won the Collegiate Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin title.

From 1995 through 2000 he coached the boys and girls varsity teams at MacArthur High School. In 1999, MacArthur finished fourth in state and Jones was named IHSA Section XV Coach of the Year. Twice he earned Coach of the Year honors by the *Decatur Herald and Review*.

A camp coach at the Eastern Soccer School, he holds a USSF "B" coaching license and is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, earning his Premier Diploma in the summer of 2005.

THE ONLY RETIRED JERSEY IN EIU Men's Soccer History

Following the 1988 season, Eastern Illinois retired Erik Proffitt's jersey. A two-year letter-winner, he recorded one goal and seven assists while playing in all 38 games in his two seasons. Under coach Cizo Mosina, Proffitt and the Panthers won the AMCU (Mid-Continent) Conference title in 1987 and shared the crown in 1988. Originally from Wichita, Kansas, his life was tragically cut short at the age of 20.
